4. Issues Raised for Discussion with Mr. Rabjohn:

BOAT RAMP

The location of a boat ramp has been discussed by Township Council; uncertain what has been decided (will report back through Bob Canning).

SPEED LIMIT ON LAKE

Speed laws are province wide. Need for further clarification.

ROAD ALLOWANCE AT SHORELINE

Government of Ontario considering no further sale of road allowance property.

EMERGENCY ROUTE # SIGNS ("FIRE ROUTE SIGNS")

Budget approved by Township Counsil and signs ordered for all Oxtongue Lake cottages; will be put in place at each location by Township. Cost to owners uncertain.

ROAD SIGN

Leon Lambert requested that the "No Exit" sign on Algonquin Outfitters Road be moved from its present site to a location nearer to the highway to be more visible.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

Only a few more months until Dorset site is closed. [Council is considering expansion of the current Oxtongue site to accommodate Dorset.] The Ministry of Environment is providing little assistance to the Township on controlling dumping or finding alternate waste disposal. The Township is attempting to reduce what goes into the dump. Plans are to expand the recycling.

A schedule of tipping fees has been established for building material waste and other commercial waste as well as stoves, fridge, washers, etc.

5. COMMITTEE REPORTS

WATER LEVEL COMMITTEE

The target for mid-summer was 363.8 meters, raising the average mid-summer level about 12 inches. By August 1, 1992, the water level was 363.98 meters - 8-10 inches above the target level. The chairman suggested the higher than expected level was due to a very rainy summer. She also advised that MNR plans to start opening the dams in the park, starting with Joe Lake on September 5, 1992. This will raise the level even higher at Oxtongue Lake by Labour Day. It was agreed that no adjustment be made to the dam at this time. It will be assessed after Spring run-off in 1993 if repairs or adjustments are needed.

Expenses for the dam project totalled \$3942.70. The breakdown is as follows:

Engineering Report = \$2052.58)

Construction = \$1712.00) =\$3942.70

Legal Fees = \$ 165.32)

Miscellaneous = \$ 13.00)

Credit Balance = \$1269.88

FIRE DEPARTMENT - (Mr. Bill Service)

Numbers will be assigned to each home and allotted to severed lots. A map showing numbering of all lots will be posted at Oxtongue Community Centre.
