

MINUTES OF MEETING HELD IN THE MUNICIPAL OFFICE, DORSSET, ONTARIO,
SATURDAY MORNING, AUGUST 14th, 1965

Mr. Claud McMaster who acted as Chairman pro-tem, and Mrs. Parker of the Otter Lake Cottagers' Association explained why the meeting had been called. It was agreed that we should go ahead with a temporary organization.

Chairman: On motion of Mr. Davies, seconded by Mr. Bach, DR. WM. KEITH was appointed chairman.

Secretary: On motion of Dr. Keith, seconded by Mr. Grills, MRS. N.H. PARKER was appointed secretary.

NAME: It was agreed that the name of the organization should be THE SHERSBOURNE, MacLINTOCK & LIVINGSTON COUNCIL OF COTTAGERS' ASSOCIATIONS and that the purpose of the organization should be to seek to co-operate with year round inhabitants for the mutual benefit of the total community, and to present to Municipal Council the needs of each association as well as those which are common to all.

VICE-CHAIRMAN: Moved by Mr. Grills, seconded by Mr. Bach and carried that Mr. Kenneth DAVIES be Vice-Chairman and that Mr. McMaster from Otter Lake and a representative to be chosen by the Crozier Lake Association be members of the Executive.

It was agreed that questions to be brought to the Municipal Council that evening be:

1. To ask for a copy of the voters' list.
2. To ask for a break-down of income tax from taxes. What percentage comes from summer residents.
3. To ask for a change in the date of municipal elections in order to make it possible for the largest possible number of votes to be cast by cottagers. Thanksgiving Saturday or Monday were thought to be the most desirable dates.
4. To ask for a report on road development in the area.

What money is spent annually?

How much do various branches of Government contribute?

What is involved in the plans for the next five years?

Why should money be spent on a road that cottagers do not want such as 657 when a road is so badly needed by an area where cottagers have to travel miles by boat?

5. To ask that members of this organization be sent notification of Council meetings.

6. To put before Council certain specific needs mentioned by representatives:
Kawagama: Better road and docking area for Fletcher Bay.

Crozier: Winter fishing closed if possible. Dept. of Lands & Forest.

Permission in writing to use the garbage dump.

Lowering of water level by having culverts cleaned out periodically

Otter Lake: Larger dock and ramp for boats.

Better arrangements for garbage.

A clearing away of trees and brush which obstruct the view

when making a left turn off the Hollow Lake road on to the road to the
garbage dump.

It was agreed that we should try to contact associations or key people on other lakes:
Slin, Fletcher, Raven, Red Pine, Livingston, Crown Lake, Harwood. *St. Noris, & Sherbourne.*
